# **POSITION SUMMARY**

Teacher Trainees undertake their role with a view to complete an accredited initial teacher education (ITE) course through Alphacrucis University College (AC) and to enter employment with Launceston Christian School as a registered teacher upon course completion.

Teacher Trainees will work alongside a mentor teacher for each year of their employment/training and will undertake progressive duties over this period to build their practice skills in preparation for graduate teaching proficiency.

It is expected that the incumbent will bring a Christian world view to bear on the various aspects of the position and will participate fully within the spiritual life of the school.

# **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

A Teacher Trainee's duties include but are not limited to the following:

- Enrolling and progressing with their ITE course through AC, maintaining a full-time study load.
- Participating regularly and collegially in the Teaching Hub's 'Insight sessions' with other Teacher Trainees.
- Continually developing a Christian world view and applying this to all areas of teaching and learning;
- Establishing and maintaining a work environment that is conducive to effective teaching and learning;
- Maintaining a high standard of student behaviour and management;
- Maintaining a high level of proactive pastoral care;
- Maintaining records of progress as required;
- Proactively reporting to and communicating with teaching staff as and when required;
- Assisting in supervision duties as required;
- Attending staff devotions, activities and meetings as scheduled;
- Undertaking relevant training and development as and when required;

- Working proactively to ensure the health and safety of themselves and others;
- Participating in staff appraisal
- Developing and maintaining effective networks that support the Key Responsibilities of the role;
- Other reasonable duties as directed.

#### **Overview of program:**

1<sup>st</sup> Year

- Becoming familiar with the students, classroom routines and the school community
- Observing the mentor teacher's practice and the practice of other teachers
- Helping with general classroom duties
- Planning for and supervising small groups of students
- Checking for student understanding through questioning and marking of student work
- Attending staff and parent meetings

2<sup>nd</sup> Year

- As above
- Leading small group sessions
- Learning to develop teaching programs/lesson plans/informal and formal assessments
- Delivering short lessons to the whole class

3<sup>rd</sup> Year

- As above
- Increasing independence in planning and teaching informed by a Christian worldview
- Deepening understanding of curriculum development and assessment strategies
- Delivering lessons for a full session

4<sup>th</sup> Year

- As above
- Teaching full days
